This month, Trusted Source spotlights Bitty and Beau's Coffee Shop, a nonprofit business that opened last year in Wilmington, North Carolina, staffed by individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Started by Amy Wright

and her husband, whose two youngest children, Bitty and Beau, have Down syndrome, the Wrights set inclusion and acceptance as their business mandate. The shop, originally 500 sq feet with 19 employees with IDD, has since expanded to 5,000 sq feet with 40 employees with IDD.
