

This interview with Jared Hara and his band, Symmetry is an example of Ouch! with their effective and genuine in their approach.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND





Accessibility

This video is accessible to all. Take note of the clarity of the captions, how easy they are to read and follow, without taking away from the interview.

Simplicity of Allyship

In the video, Hara mentions after going blind at age 11, his teachers asked him what instrument he wanted to play. After choosing the guitar, his teachers encouraged him and saw him as capable.

Hara also points out the importance of his other band members. Their aid in making simple accommodations allow him to have full participation in the band with minimal natural supports.

Talent that Speaks for Itself

Symmetry is a band that is growing in popularity through their music. Jared Hara observes that many fans do not know that he is visually impaired upon first introduction to the band. This is proof that he is looked upon as an artist first. Hara feels good having a career in a typical way, not having the first thing people know about him is that he has low vision.

Ouch! Video



It is important to acknowledge the atmosphere in the UK surrounding the voices of people with disabilities. The fact that a podcast like Ouch! can be successful is because ableism is being taught prominently in schools and throughout the community. Representation and exposure allow for underrepresented groups to speak more openly about their experiences; positive or negative, but always honestly. This podcast is an outgrowth of a culture of inclusivity.
